### Open to See

If we as people don't desire to stretch in generosity, then we probably never will. It is very hard to ask God for a miracle in your finances, work or family that you don't desire with all of your heart. The book of Psalms 37:4 says: "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart."

As we delight ourselves in God and His work, we will find the desires of our heart align with His. This is the starting point of faith: a strong desire to serve God with all your heart.

### Open to Do

Do you desire to make a difference? Do you desire to be generous? If you do, it should be written all over your face. It should become one of the greatest priorities of your life. Take time to evaluate your desires, and ask yourself, "Do my desires align with the heart of God?" If they do, then you are at the starting point of faith. Begin to pray bold prayers.
